### **Brian Hughes: Sponsor Spotlight**



Brian Hughes is a vice president at Fremont Bank overseeing the Nonprofit Group. The group is responsible for the growth and development of the nonprofit client banking, corporate giving programs, and community reinvestment act (CRA). He also serves as the Executive Director of the Fremont Bank Foundation, a philanthropic entity established in 1995 by Brian's grandparents, Morris and Alvirda Hyman, the founders of Fremont Bank. He

leverages his longstanding reputation in the local community to strengthen the partnership of the community with Fremont Bank and its Foundation.

Brian has been with the bank for over 25 years, serving in various management roles within the areas of information technology, commercial lending, branch operations, and nonprofits business development.

Fremont Bank established the Nonprofit Group in 2008 to strengthen its relationship with the nonprofit sector. Since its inception, this group has grown to over 360 nonprofit agencies with deposits totals over \$160 million. The group caters to all nonprofits representing education and youth, social and human care, arts and culture, and health and wellness.

Brian currently serves on the boards of the Fremont Bank Foundation, St. Rose Hospital Foundation, and Kidango. He lives in Fremont with his wife and youngest daughter. He has an older daughter and two grandchildren. In his free time, he simply just enjoys life.

HERS is deeply grateful to Brian and the Fremont Bank Foundation for their ongoing support. Brian was kind enough to talk to us about working with nonprofits:

What's the most interesting thing you've learned in your years working with area nonprofits? It's the people. I have met so many fascinating and wonderful people in the nonprofit sector. Everyone is passionate about the cause and trying to make our world a better place.

What's your favorite thing about community building and working with nonprofits? Learning...I have learned so much from the nonprofits. Each agency has their own story on how and why they got started. Learning about challenges they face and the success they have had. Some agencies are battling a long fight (cancer research), where others just need to make one person's life a little bit easier (a quilt for a sick child).

What are some of the special financial challenges nonprofits face? The biggest financial challenges are within the agency themselves. Agencies need to view themselves as a business. They need to make money. Without a profit how can you grow and expand your services? Costs normally don't go down. Some of the most successful nonprofits run like a business: earnings and expenses are evaluated, budgets are made, and five year plans are established.

How long has Fremont Bank Foundation been working with HERS? Our first grant to HERS was in 2000 for the Keep Abreast Walk. Through 2016, we have given HERS \$298,947. I personally know that every person we have sent to HERS has come back to me and said "Thank you!" HERS has helped so many women going through a sensitive and challenging time. The respect and compassion HERS provides to their clients has been so positive it is hard to overlook.

#### Please share one of your personal inspirations:

If I had the opportunity to sit and have a conversation with someone, that person would be Walt Disney. I am a huge fan of Walt Disney, the business man. His life is very compelling – rising to worldwide acclaim from early childhood conflicts with family, failed businesses, and the loss of his first hit character Oswald. Walt is the ultimate role model for never giving up on your dreams.
