Paul Wotowic, M.D. is a plastic surgeon at San Ramon Regional Medical Center. After serving as a medical officer in the U.S. Navy, Dr. Wotowic started a private practice in the Bay Area. He has active staff privileges at John Muir and San Ramon Region Medical Center where he served in leadership positions as Chief of Surgery and two terms as Chief of Staff. His training and practice reflects the full spectrum of plastic surgery including cosmetic, reconstructive, and nuanced areas of pediatric plastic

surgery and facial reconstruction; he is board certified in both plastic surgery and otolaryngology.


