

Best Friends and Sisters

One of the first things everyone notices about Kanan is her smile; she simply radiates warmth. She is also a deeply caring and sensitive person, which is evident as she shares details about the loss of her beloved sister, Meera. Close since childhood, they were not just sisters, they were best friends. Together they learned to navigate life in the United States after immigrating with their parents from India and shared highs and lows, supporting each other as they experienced the journey into adulthood.

The news of Meera's breast cancer diagnosis in early 2019 was a terrible shock. Meera was young and vibrant; the trauma of the news was compounded by the rarity of her cancer and the struggle to find appropriate treatment. As her sister's illness progressed, Kanan remembers vividly how she and their mother stayed by Meera's bedside through many tearful days and nights.

Surgery and treatments were painful and weakened Meera, but there were bright spots. Kanan recalls that her sister became a HERS patient, receiving post-surgical products, compassionate care, and a heart-shaped pillow which gave Meera much-needed comfort. Sadly, Meera passed away a short 10 months after her diagnosis. It was January 2020 and she was just 39 years old. Kanan's sense of loss and hopelessness were still part of her daily life when, in late 2020, she received her own breast cancer diagnosis.

Kanan also embarked on a spiritual journey, which continues to help put her experiences into perspective. Today, three years after her diagnosis, Kanan is deeply grateful for her body, her mind, her health, and her life.

Serving patients like Kanan and her sister Meera is a privilege for our team, and we are grateful that Kanan has entrusted their story with us. It is our hope that Kanan's journey will deepen your understanding of how and why we strive to restore HERS -- Hope, Empowerment, Renewal, and Support -- in our patients.
